

## "Identity Management & Fraud"

## Abstract:

You're doing your investigation and you have figured out who your perpetrator is or at lest you think you have. But what do you really know about them? Are they who they claim to be? Do they really exist or is their identity synthetic? Do they have an alias or a previous identity that, once known, may reveal all? With the ever-increasing volume of identity information made available to fraudsters through data breaches, phishing, and other scams it is far easier today to develop a false identity than it has ever been. In this session we will discuss identity theft, identity fraud and employment fraud, what identity documents contain verifiable security features for you to be able to confirm who you are dealing with and the legal methods people use to change their names and hide their pasts.
